When talking about their 'sweat equity', Felicia mentioned that her dad built houses for a living. Unfortunately, she has Narcolepsy and needs to take naps during the day, so she's unable to work. Her family is ready to jump in to help volunteer and fundraise. Mac will be putting in her hours and asking friends to help. She's interested to see how creative she can be when building her home. She and Mac look forward to decorating their new walls.
